

Wraparound hood

Tools:

- Size 11 straight needles
- 2 stitch markers
- 6mm crochet hook
- 150g (3 balls) Holstgarn Cielo

Gauge:

14st x 24 rows = 4" x 4"

This hood begins with knitting a scarf. Stitches are then picked up in the middle of one edge of the scarf. The back of the head is knit from those stitches, then the top of the head is built using a modified square/dutch heel turn. It is finished with a crocheted edge.



Scarf

Cast on 24 stitches to size 11 needles

Rows 1-315: knit

As you knit, place markers at row 114 and 203

Cast off

Hood

Rotate piece to pick up stitches along edge:

Pick up 54 stitches evenly from row 114 - 203 (marked previously)

This is 3 stitches per every 5 rows (think: 1, skip, 2, 3, skip)

Rows 1-35: knit

Row 36 (rs): knit 18, place marker, knit 18, place marker, knit 18.

In the next two rows you will do two decreases, both will use the stitches on either side of these two stitch markers, respectively.

Row 37 (ws): knit 35, k2tog, turn.

Row 38 (rs): s1pw wyib, knit 17, ssp, turn.
You should now be able to see a gap on either side of your middle 18 stitches. From now on your k2tog and ssp stitches will use the two stitches on either side of the gap.

Row 39 (ws): s1kw wyif, knit to one before gap, k2tog, turn.

Row 40 (rs): s1pw wyib, knit to one before gap, ssp, turn.

Repeat rows 39-40 until you have only one stitch on either side of your middle 18 stitches.

Cast off all stitches

Crochet Edge

Join yarn at any point of edge using 6mm crochet hook, ch1, sc in same stitch.

Single crochet around the entire border of the piece as follows:

When working perpendicular to knit rows, sc in every other row.

When working parallel to knit rows, sc in every stitch.

To round a convex corner, 3sc in corner stitch

To round a concave corner, sc on either side of the corner stitch, skipping the corner stitch.

Join to first sc with a sl st, break yarn.

Weave in all ends
